GENERAL RULES OF ENTRY

1. All exhibitors must have adequate public liability insurance.
2. All trophies to be held for one year only and to be returned **CLEAN** 14 days before the 2024 show.
3. Cars requiring to park in the wagon park will be charged £15, car park £10
4. All entries to be taken online www.hambletonshow.com, entries close 12th May 2024, from 13th May entries will be double fee, no entries to be accepted after 18th May. No postal entries or entries taken on the day
5. If the show re-schedules its show date (usually due to adverse weather conditions) the entry fee will be refunded less an administration cost of 25%, the secretary must have a request of refund **BEFORE** the new show date, under no circumstances will a refund be given after the new show date. If the show is completely abandoned, refunds will only be given upon receipt of an SAE addressed to the secretary, the entry fee will be refunded less an administration cost of 25%. SAE must be received within 28 days of the cancellation.
6. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to check if the show is still taking place due to bad weather.
7. Entry fee **WILL NOT** be refunded if the horses, owners or riders are not correctly registered with the relevant societies before the show day.
8. All prize money, prizes and cups to be collected on the show days, nothing to be sent out after the show days.
9. **CHAMPION OR RESERVE CHAMPION PRIZE MONEY WILL NOT BE GIVEN OUT UNTIL AFTER THE SUPREMES. To be collected from secretary's tent on the day of the show.**
10. The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry.
11. The organisers reserve the right to cancel or amalgamate any classes.
12. No responsibility will be accepted by the organisers for accidents or damage to riders, competitors, spectators, owners or animals or any other property.
13. The decision of the judge is final.
14. Hard hats must be worn at all times when mounted, whether competing or not. Please see B.S.P.S. Rule 43 regarding all B.S.P.S. classes
15. Any objection or protest must be made in writing to the secretary accompanied by a fee of £50 which may be forfeited to the show funds in the event of an objection been over ruled
16. **No litter is to be left on the showground. CLEANING OUT OF HORSEBOXES AND TRAILERS IS STRICTLY FORBIDDEN**
17. No nomination or substitute entries will be accepted.
18. Under no circumstances is any animal to be exhibited under a judge who is known to have bred, leased, sold or produced that animal.
19. **All grooms entering the ring must be correctly dressed and must wear a hat in the ring.**
20. Entry fees will only be returned (minus 25%) with a valid vet's or doctor's certificate **BEFORE** show day
21. Prize money: For all Ridden and In-hand classes prize money will be awarded as follows. Three entries or less 1st prize only, four or five entries 1st and 2nd Prize and 6 or more entries as per schedule.
22. **RULES FOR RIDDEN SPORTS HORSE AFFILIATED CLASSES.** It is strongly recommended that competitors aged 18 or over wear Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the following current Safety Standards: All PAS 015; VG1; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards. It is mandatory for competitors under the age of 18 to wear such skull caps or hats. In the jumping phase of working hunter classes the aforementioned skull caps/riding hats must be worn. No earrings to be worn when competing in the Sports Horse GB affiliated classes, and horses must be shod on all four hooves.
23. All horses and ponies entering the Showground must be vaccinated, and vaccination certificates / passports must accompany the horse or pony to the Show and be available for checking. Un-vaccinated horses, or those exhibitors unable to produce a passport on request will be prevented from competing and will be asked to leave the showground. Entry fees will not be refunded.

Which is a qualifier for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, 9th – 13th October 2024. The objective of the competition is to find the supreme light horse or pony in hand champion of the year, irrespective of breed or type (excluding heavy horses).

The Champion horse or pony from the following classes will be eligible to compete in the Price Family Supreme In Hand Semi Final, provided it has not already won a Supreme In-Hand qualifier in 2024.

If the Champion has already qualified for Horse of the Year Show 2024 or is ineligible, then the Reserve Champion may come forward to The NPS Great British In-Hand Show, provided it has not already qualified and is eligible. If both Champion and Reserve Champion have already qualified for Horse of the Year Show 2024 or are ineligible then the Semi-Final will not be represented at the NPS Great British In-Hand Show. Foal champions and geldings four years old and over are not eligible to compete or eligible to qualify for Horse of the Year Show.

In the event of a horse/pony having been awarded more than one section Championship at this show, that horse/pony will represent both/all sections and the Semi-Final qualification will not pass down to the Reserve Champion in the 2nd and any subsequent sections.

All classes are open to Yearlings, 2 year olds, 3 year olds, Stallions, broodmares and barren mares only. Broodmares must be with foal at foot or a relevant certificate of pregnancy. Mares which have not yet foaled or that have lost their foals are eligible to enter with a relevant certificate of pregnancy for the following year.

There will be no direct entry into the Supreme In-Hand Championship Semi Final, all animals must be a section champion or reserve champion (as applicable).

Judges need not be registered on any society Judge's panel but must possess sufficient experience to judge.

All horses competing in classes 34 – 36 and 38 – 41 must be eligible under the below criteria.

Only horses registered with or overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and in the correct ownership are eligible for entry.

- All Pure Bred Breeding and Youngstock In-hand exhibits must be the progeny of a Graded Mare (ID Class 1, Class 2, RID (GB), AID or Supplementary Grade Up Register) and be by a Class 1, Class 2 or RID (GB) stallion on the Irish Draught Breed Register.
- All Sport Horses must be registered on the Irish Draught Sport Horse Register.
- All competing STALLIONS must be the progeny of a Graded Mare (ID Class 1, Class 2, RID (GB), AID or Supplementary Grade Up Register) by a Class 1, Class 2 or RID (GB) stallion and be inspected or overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and classified as RID (GB), ID Class 1 or ID Class 2 OR be a Registered Irish Draught Sport Horse Stallion, and they must display a red, white and blue ribbon in their tails.
- All riders of STALLIONS must be 18 years of age or over.
- All in-hand stallions and 1, 2 and 3 year old colts must be bitted and shown by an experienced handler of 18 years or over.
- All ridden horses must be 4 years and over and 153cm (15hh) or over.

The owners of all Pure-bred Irish Draught horses must be full members of the IDHS (GB). This rule does not apply to owners of Irish Draught Sport Horses. Registration numbers to be stated on the entry form and entries will be sent to the IDHS (GB) prior to the Show to confirm eligibility. .

- Own/Part own an equestrian establishment including but not limited to; riding schools, events centre, stud, or livery yard in any capacity, or receive any form of remuneration for employment at an equestrian establishment. For the avoidance of doubt for the purpose of this rule, immediate family members of an owner or part owner of an equestrian establishment who work or are howsoever otherwise engaged or involved in any capacity, whether or not for remuneration at the equestrian establishment, will be treated as being an owner or part owner of that equestrian establishment.
- Show a Horse owned or sponsored by a company or a commercial firm, or act as a Brand Ambassador, in any showing classes, SHB(GB) or otherwise, or a Horse for which his/her immediate family accepts livery or training charges from a person outside the immediate family concerned.

A competitor is not eligible to compete in Amateur classes on an Exhibit, which has been ridden by a Professional Rider in any Open classes, UK Ponies and Horses or otherwise, with the exception of Open Working Show Horse and Side Saddle classes, during the current year and the previous year, up to but not including the Royal International Horse Show.

The above Rule does not apply, if the Horse has been Professionally Produced and only ridden by a Professional, during the current season, or if the horse has subsequently been sold and re-registered under new Ownership.

No person included on any affiliated Judging Panel can compete in a UK Ponies and Horses Amateur Class. UK Ponies and Horses feel that this is not entering into the spirit of the competition.

On the day when an Exhibit is competing in an Amateur class, Professionals are not allowed to ride or work-in the relevant animal. No Professional Producers are allowed into the ring to groom/strip the Horse (B) Amateur Owner/Rider. Open to Horses owned and ridden by an Amateur, (the Rider need not be the Owner of the Horse). This ruling will also apply to Amateurs who wish to compete in the Annual Amateur Points Awards. No Professional Producers are allowed into the ring to groom/strip the Horse. (C) Amateur Home Produced. Open to Horses, which are either stabled at home or in a D. I. Y. yard and which since 1st January in the current year, have not been shown by a Professional during the current season or stabled in a Professional yard at any time in the current year. To be ridden by an Amateur. This does not exclude Amateur Owner Home Produced riders having lessons at any time with an instructor, providing the Horse remains stabled at home. No Professional Producers are allowed into the ring to groom/strip the Horse.

The two highest placed exhibits not already qualified will qualify for the Rescue Equine Society Final to be held at Equifest, Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on the 1st – 4th August 2024.

Definition of Rescue:

1. Any equine that is adopted, fostered, under a guardianship scheme from any National Equine Welfare Council registered Charity (NEWC).
2. Any equine that has been adopted, fostered, under a guardianship scheme from any other equine charity (must be registered with the Charity Commission).
3. Any equine that has been 'independently' rescued by an individual. There must be supporting evidence (photographic, veterinary) that will be included in the 'Rescue History' for the equine, to demonstrate their rescue status.

Mark System:

The mark system is designed to reward those equines that have the strongest rescue history and most dramatic 'transformation'. Marks are awarded as follows:

Rescue History and Transformation - 60%

Performance - 40%

In the event of a tie, the Rescue History and Transformation takes precedence. All entries are asked to provide, on entry to the class, a written 'Rescue History', detailing the background and history of the equine. Also, to be included are 'before' and 'after' photographs. This will be for the Judge to discuss with the competitor during the Judging of the Class and marks awarded accordingly. (A template for the layout for this Rescue History can be found on the Rescue Equine Showing Society website)

Steps will be taken to manage it as practically as possible. Any potential conflicts will be written and displayed next to the scoreboard. SECTION II Jumping: NO time will be allowed between these sections for any adjustment to tack or rider's dress. (40 marks) Maximum height of fences 0.90m (4 years) 1.05m (5 years). **Fall of horse or rider or a total of 3 refusals will result in elimination.**

Note: fence height at Final 1.00m (4 years) and 1.10m (5 years).

SECTION III Potential to Lengthen Stride: immediately after the jumping the 5 year old horses will be required to gallop. The 4 year olds will only be required to lengthen the canter indicating they could learn to gallop with further development and maturity.
